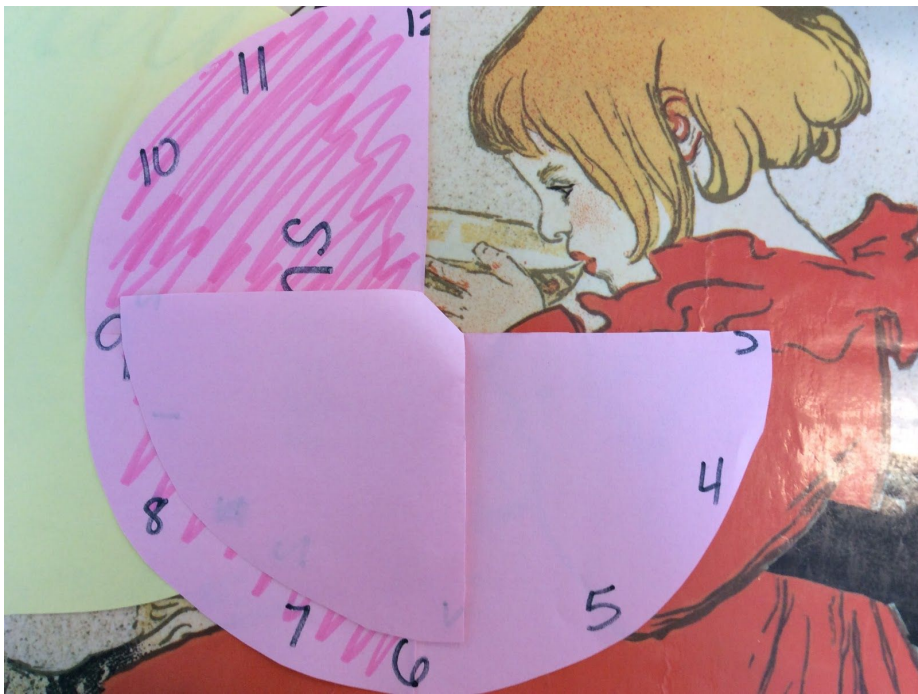
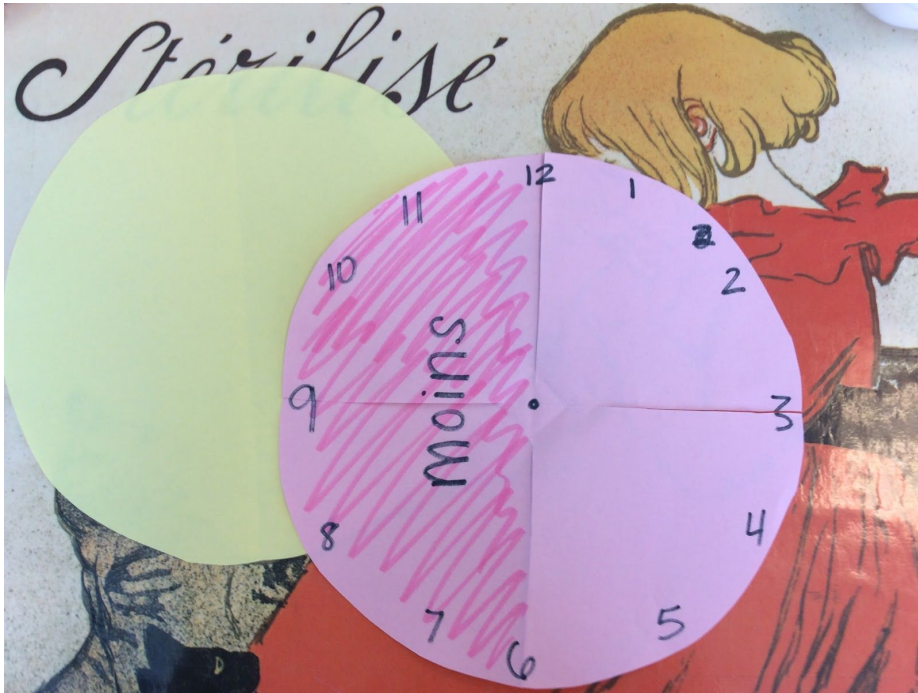
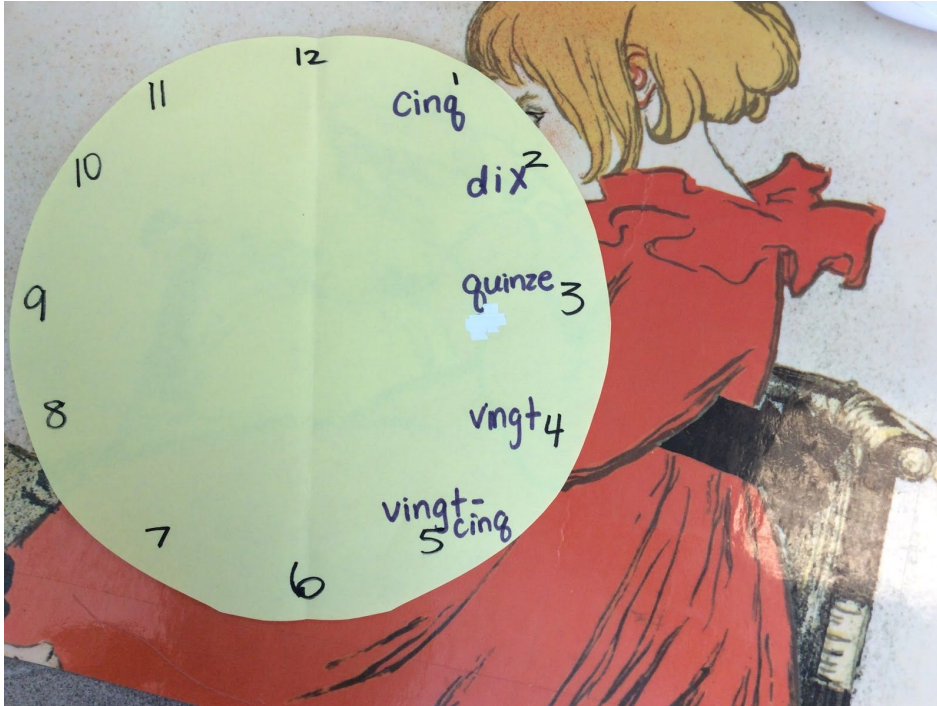


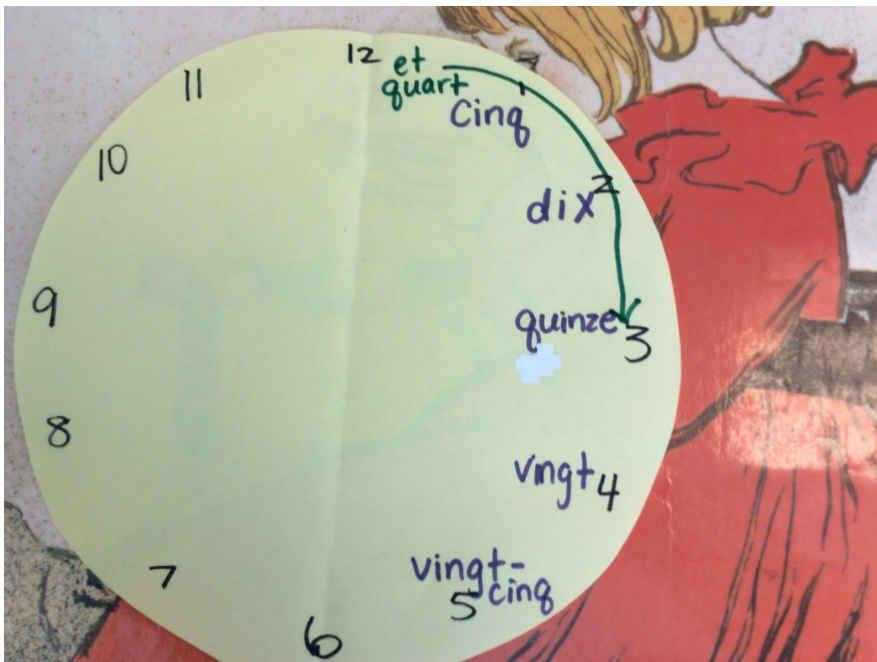
1. This is the point that we got to in class today. Make sure the sides are all cut to about 1cm from the middle. Make sure you have all of the numbers and that you have shaded in the second half of the clock to indicate that those are the minutes that require subtraction.



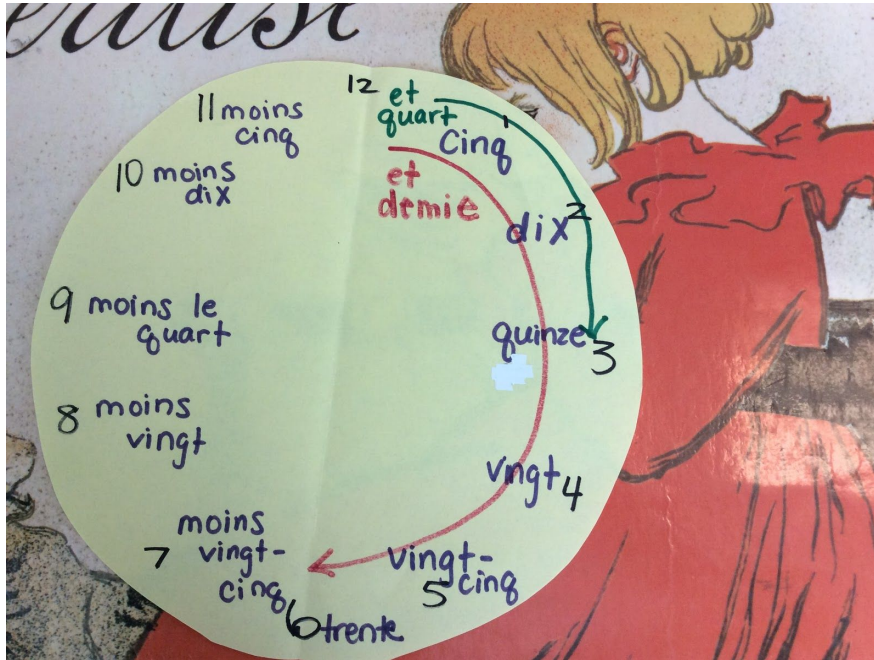
2. Take the second part of the clock and write the numbers again.
On the first half of the clock, write the numbers of the minutes you will say for each number. Ex: the number 1 on the clock indicates 5 minutes, so you would say “cinq”



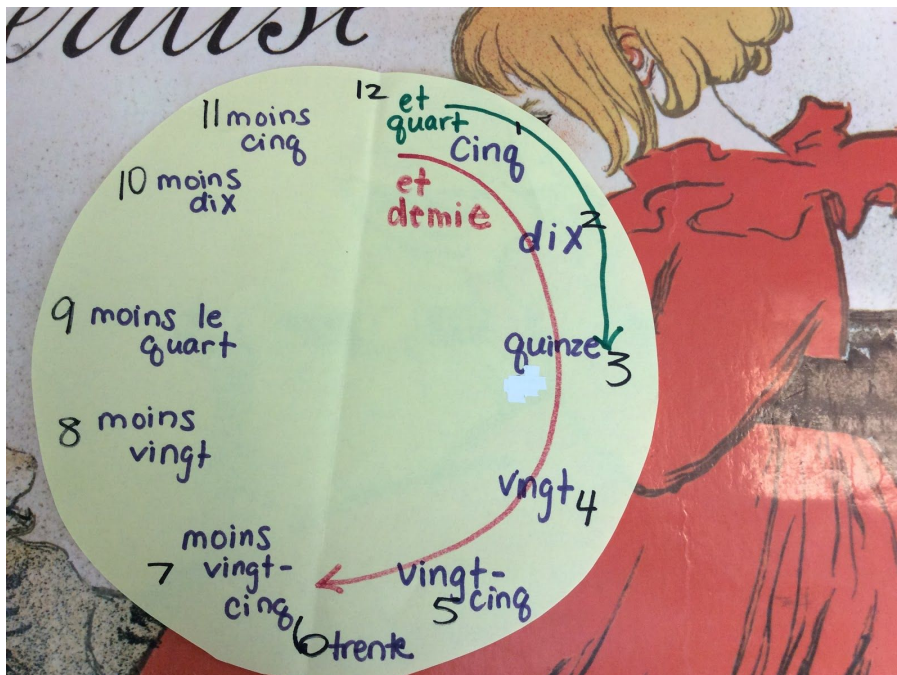
3. In a new color, draw an arrow from the 12 to the 3 and label it as “et quart” to indicate that “et quart” means “quarter after.”



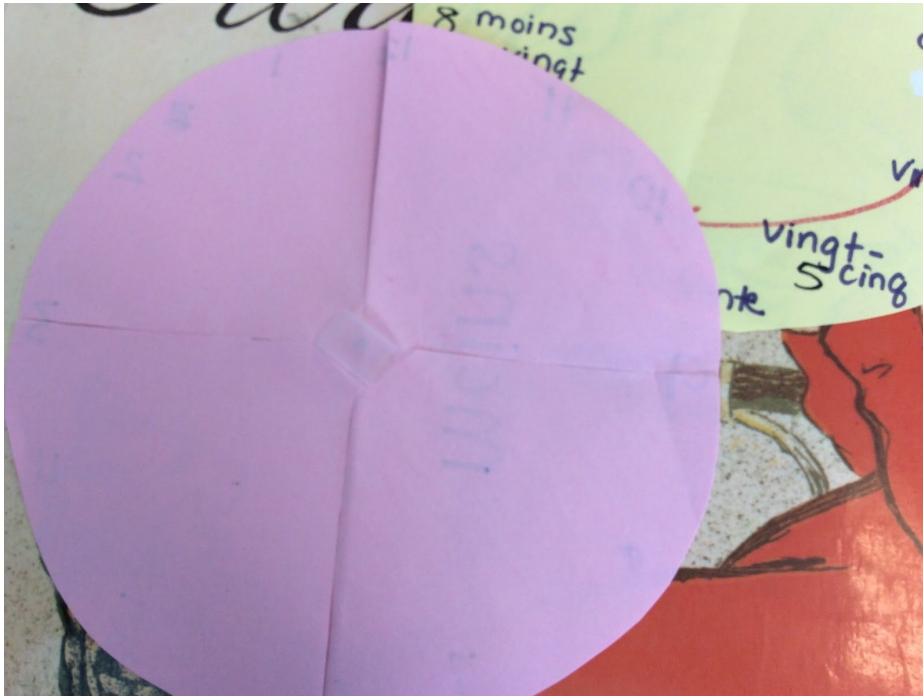
4. In another color, draw an arrow from the 12 to the 6 and label it as “et demie” to indicate that “et demie” means “half past.”



5. For the second half of the clock, say what you would subtract from the next hour up to get to that minute.
Ex: 3:45 = four hours minus 15 = quatre heures moins le quart (quinze).



6. Next, attach the top circle to the bottom circle by placing a piece of rolled tape in the center on the back of the top circle.



7. Here is your final product! Attach it to page 60 of your Cahier Interactif, but make sure you can open all of the flaps.
